User Guide for FSC FM Online Reporting Template



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Preface

This guide has been developed to facilitate the use of the FM online reporting template (further referred to as “Template”). Instructions are grouped according to the sections of the Template. You should be able to use this manual as an accompanying tool to reference specific sections of the Template. The instructions include explanations on how to enter data to existing fields or provide clarifications on the expected scope of information.

FSC will welcome feedback on this guide at auditreport@fsc.org.

Important Considerations

- Make sure you have the latest version of the FM online word AddIn installed. For more information about the AddIn, please refer to the [FSC FM Online AddIn Installation guide](#).
- Make sure you have at least a Memory RAM of 8.00 GB, and a 64-bit Windows operating system for smooth functionality.
- Do not have more than one Template open for the AddIn to work.
- Once the full online reporting functionality is used, initial entry will be effortful and will require approximately 7 hours, while subsequently allowing saving of time. Upon the first upload of the data to FSC Data Base (DB), You will not need to re-enter data at every surveillance evaluation, e.g., species, MU, or corrective actions data. You will be able to fetch the data from the DB to Templates for subsequent evaluation.
 - The core data entered about e.g., species in the first report using the Template will be uploaded to and saved in the FSC DB, if all modules are implemented (Mandatory from 1 January 2022). For the next evaluation, the core data from previous reports can be fetched to the Template.
 - The core data only changes if new additions or edits are made (e.g., new species added) or old records removed.
- If there is a correction needed to the previous finalized and submitted report, it can be made by using the “Submit errata” function of the AddIn.
 - Please note that the function only works if a certification body has implemented FM online Module, which is only mandatory from January 2022 and will be available for testing in 2021.
 - If the Template is used as a replacement for CB’s own template before 1 January 2022, the Template can be manually corrected and re-uploaded into the FSC Salesforce throughout 2021.

Numbering System

- The numbering system used in this user guide is aligned with the numbering of specific sections of the Template to help you navigate and querying specific sections.

General Guidance

- You can share the Template with a Certificate Holder (HC) for initial entry of information. However, access to the FM online module shall not be shared.
- You can add your Certification Body (CB) logo by replacing the FSC logo above the title page of the Template "Forest Management Certification Audit Report". Once you right click on the FSC logo, a pop-up box appears with a message "Can be replace by CB logo". Hover through it and then right-click on the change picture icon. This will provide a drop-down list with several options to insert your logo.



- The Template does not support bullet editorial format.
- To add or delete sections that can be multiplied, highlight the top row of the section/cassette, and right click, then select the option you desire from the drop-down list. Alternatively, you can right click the bottom right row, a plus icon will pop-up, click on this icon to insert a new section.
- Data should be entered in only one language (avoid double language entries). The translation to the other required language will be provided automatically upon uploading the data to the system and creation of the public summary.
- The separators of the numeric values could be either full stop "." Or comma "," depending on the language of the Template. Comma "," for French, German, Portuguese, Russian, Ukrainian, Spanish, and full stop "." for English, Chinese and Japanese.
- The AddIn automatically converts the comma to full stop and vice versa based on the language of the Template. For example, even if you type full stop "." as the separator, it automatically converts into comma for Spanish Template.
- In the current version of the Template, there is no need for specifying whether the evaluation is desk, hybrid, or field evaluation. The data gathered in the evaluation shall be inserted as for field evaluation and the information about the evaluation being desk, hybrid or field can be entered in the field "Additional techniques employed for evaluation*" in the "Sampling and documents" in Section 4 "The evaluation process".

- If there is a mandatory numeric field required (e.g., “Area of forest owned/managed but excluded from Mus in the scope of certification”), yet there is no relevant value for the evaluation, value “0.0” shall be entered.
- If there is a mandatory text field required, yet there is no relevant information for the evaluation, the value “N/A” should be provided.
- If there is mandatory field with the checkbox which provides “yes” option (e.g., “Ecosystem Services (ES) in the scope”), but this option is not relevant for the evaluation, the checkbox shall be left empty.
- It is possible to add additional data than what is required by FSC, such as a list of sites visited during an audit. This is done by simply adding additional fields in the Template. However, this additional data will not be uploaded to and stored in the FSC DB. Only summary data included in regular Template fields will be consumed by FSC and included in the public summary.
- The Template does not require providing information as per clause 1.5 in FSC-STD-20-007, including interpretation INT-STD-20-007_61.
- The current version of the Template does not require information whether the audit was a desk, or hybrid of field audit

- 1.7 “Impacted” refers to parties that are affected by forest management activities in a way that their conditions/actions have been altered by forest management activities of the certified operation in comparison to the conditions/actions of these parties in the scenario where forest management activities would not be taking place.
- 1.9 This field shall be used to report on areas exercised from certification according to FSC-POL-20-003. Please note that the elaboration and justification of the excision and specific references to the Policy shall be provided in section 3 Summary of forest context (general and brief description) and 7- Observations (detailed references to Policy clauses as applicable).
- 1.12 If you check Ecosystem Services in your scope, you will have to fill in Annex A and B. By default, Annex B is hidden; however, as soon as you check Ecosystem services in your scope, Annex B will pop-up. The AddIn must be installed and activated for this to work.



1.14 Consideration of a species as a main commercial species is at the discretion of a CB.

- To enter the species, you can either chose it from a drop – down list available in the field or type directly. The drop-down list provides a list of most common species. Other species need to be typed in and if there is a mistake made, the name will be underlined in red. The misspelled species name can be corrected by right clicking and following a dictionary suggestion for the correct name.
- In case of hybrids, CB shall enter only one species.
- Always full name (genus and species) is required. In case of uncertainty, CB shall choose the most likely specie and justify the choice in the field “Remarks”.

1.17 CB shall enter the volume of harvest relevant for the current calendar year, as per annual management plans. E.g., if the is conducted in June 2020, the total population volume of harvest for this species in 2020 should be entered. If there are no management plans available for the species, it questions this species to be a main commercial species. If CB wants to include it regardless (e.g., for the purpose of eventual future transactions verifications), the estimate of volume is acceptable.

1.19 The CB shall enter a value relevant for the previous calendar year. E.g., if evaluation has taken place in March 2020, the total volume of products sold with FSC claim in 2019 shall be entered. If the evaluation has been conducted in September 2020, the same 2019 volume shall be entered.



- To add a spare section, highlight the top row of the section and right click to select the option you desire from the drop-down list. Alternatively, you can right click the bottom right row, a plus icon will pop-up, click on this icon to insert a new section.
- FSC used different technologies to collect data from several data sources to build this list, for example, from ITTO – International Tropical Timber Organization or other plant related databases.
- The list of species available in the Template is integrated through a species dictionary embedded in the Template. It counts for approximately 3000 species.
- The Template provides a list of most common species to choose from. Other species need to be typed in and the embedded dictionary will indicate any errors from directly typing the name in. The misspelled species name can be corrected by right clicking and following a dictionary suggestion for the correct name.
- Hopefully, the scenario of a missing species is a theoretical one. FSC has made a lot of effort to provide an exhaustive list for FSC certified forests. In an unlikely case when a given species is not available, please contact FSC at auditreport@fsc.org.
- FSC also hopes that the provided list will be an improvement compared to the current situation with multiple different entries for the same species in our current database, as the list contains no duplication, as well no subspecies, no variation, no hybrid, and no clones.
- In an unlikely case, if you encounter a problem, please contact us at auditreport@fsc.org.

- If an evaluation report needs to include a hybrid species e.g., from a plantation, it is indicated by choosing one of the species of the hybrid and adding information about the hybrid in the “Remarks#” field.
- FSC is aware that some forest areas have multiple species in their inventory and that adding each species will require adding a new row and selecting the species from the prepared list.
- FSC is aware that some forest areas have multiple species in their inventory and that adding each species will require adding a new row and selecting the species from the prepared list. However, for the time being it is not possible to create separate spreadsheets for species entry to accompany the word Template. To ensure that the solution provided was simple as possible for everyone to use, FSC opted not to add complexity by adding multiple solutions.
- The species will need to be enter only once for a given certified operation and can then be fetched from the database unless composition of species or their classification as main commercial species changes over time.

last day of the last audit period, resulting in a very long audit duration. The actual audit dates can then be inserted into the “Audit Itinerary” section, to ensure better data quality.

4.5 The role “Team member” shall be used for technical expert and the expertise described in the field “profile”. If a given team member represents more than one role, the main role shall be chosen in the field “Role”, while the other roles shall be listed in the “profile” field.

4.8 This field refers to the Unique Auditor Identifier according to ASI auditor registry.

4.12 Specific options provided in this field should be checked if a given documentation was sought by the auditor, even if no records have been produced. E.g. if an auditor was inspecting complaints/disputes or Concession Agreements, but there was no complain or dispute present, nor agreements signed in the period since last evaluation, the boxes for these should be checked. The field should reflect the type of records that have been controlled that are relevant for a given CH and were in the focus of this particular evaluation – i.e. it is not the intention to check all the boxes for any potential records that might have existed.

- 4.15 & 4.16 These voluntary fields relate to the wage paid in the FME or group under evaluation. In the case of contractors being paid on accord (by the unit of delivered product/service), the wage should be estimated based on the average units being produced within the period in which wages are paid.
- 4.17 This voluntary field refers to the number of local community members hired through management activities since the last audit.
- 4.18 This voluntary field refers to the cost incurred by CH to meet FSC requirement.
- 4.19 This voluntary field refers to the number of stakeholders affected or concerned by management activities that have proactively engaged and consulted since the last audit.
- 4.20 This voluntary field refers to measures implemented to mitigate and compensate negative social, environmental and economic impacts of management activities on affected local communities. Examples include transport services, company stores open to workers and local people, hiring of laid off workers, hiring of smallholder farmers, increased use of local services and value adding, measures to increase local economic development via other actors, etc.
